



#### Objective:

#### Activities:

Read the vocabulary words and have the students read them after you. Play the Meaning and the Rhyming Game with the words.



Have each student choose a word to illustrate. Then write a title or a sentence for his or her artwork.



Ask the students to write the following vocabulary words and find hidden words within them:

throw (row) throat (at, oat) thrush (rush, us) thrust (rust, us) throb (rob) throne (one, on)



Have the students read "The Old, Bold King" and answer the following questions:

- Q: What did the three mean men do to upset Prince Carl?
- Q: How did the King stop the men?
- Q: How did those men change?
- Q: Why were the people proud of their king?



Have the students copy the following words on index cards and then rearrange them to make a correct sentence. Remind them to capitalize the first letter in the sentence and to use a period at the end.
